RULES

1. **Horticultural Exhibits:** Classes 1–38 must be the property of the Exhibitor, and grown on his or her land.
Handicraft Exhibits: All Exhibits must be the work of the Exhibitor. Previous prize-winning items not eligible. All articles to be unused and unwashed.
2. Entries to be made on proper entry forms. Further entry forms and Schedules can be obtained from the Secretary, Committee Members and Markham's Garage.
3. All Exhibits must be staged and the Hall cleared by 10.45am and no one may be allowed to enter unless appointed by the Committee until the Hall is opened, upon completion of the judging.
4. The judges decision is final in all cases.
5. Any objection or dispute shall be settled by the Committee and its decision shall be final in all cases.
6. **Exhibitors will not be allowed to remove any Exhibits before 4.00pm. Items not collected by 4.30pm will be disposed of.**
7. All entry forms must be received by Chelsea at Kingsland Post Office, or Caroline Southgate, Stone Mill, The Wardens, Kingsland HR6 9DP – NOT LATER THAN 4.00pm Thursday, 3rd August 2017 please. Entrance fees must be paid with all entry forms.
8. The Committee reserve the right to refuse entries.
9. The Committee, whilst taking all reasonable precautions against loss or damage to Exhibitors' property, do not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage to such property at the Show.
10. First, Second and Third Prizes are awarded where the Class attracts five or more entries. Where there are less than five, prizes may be restricted.
11. Competitors must provide their own plates, vases, etc. for staging exhibits.
12. Competitors are restricted to ONE entry in any one class.
13. Points System: First: 3 points; Second: 2 point; Third: 1 point.
14. Entries to the Show will be unrestricted.
15. Juniors may enter any class higher than their own age group, including the Senior Divisions.
16. **Each entrant must complete a separate entry form** i.e. not all family names on one entry form.

VICTORIA SANDWICH

Cake Ingredients

3 medium eggs weighed in their shells (probably 6oz/170g)
The weight of the eggs in Butter / Soft Margarine
The weight of the eggs in Caster Sugar
The weight of the eggs in SR Flour
Raspberry Jam to fill – home made / good quality

Method

1. Set oven Gas 4 160C (fan oven) or 180C
2. Grease and base line the bottom of 2 x 20cm / 8" sandwich tins
3. Cream butter / margarine and sugar
4. Beat the eggs, then gradually add to the mixture, beating well each time
5. Sieve the flour and fold into the mixture with a metal spoon
6. Divide equally between the 2 tins and bake 25 mins in the middle of the oven
7. They are ready when they are golden, shrunk from the sides of the tin and spring back when touched
8. Remove from the tins and fill with raspberry jam when cold to avoid jam bleeding into the cake
9. A light dusting of caster sugar on the top will finish it
