

## THE KINGSLAND TREASURE QUIZ

St Michael and All Angels, Kingsland, is a Grade 1 listed building, started around 1290 and endowed by the family of the future King Edward IV who won his first victory at the battle of Mortimer's Cross on the outskirts of the village. Legend has it that his enemy, Owen Tudor, the grandfather of King Henry VII, was captured in the village pub and executed the following day at Hereford.

The church fabric is sorely in need of repair. We were fortunate to be invited to go to stage 2 of a National Heritage Lottery Fund grant of nearly £500K but to release this we have to raise £37K by the end of May 2020, otherwise we lose this.

WE ARE SO CLOSE - only £10,000 to go - but because of the lockdown, our planned fundraising events cannot go ahead.
