



#### St Michael and All Angels and "Eco Church"



Eco Church is a project run in partnership with Christian Aid, The Church of England, The Methodist Church,

Tearfund, The United Reformed Church and Allchurches Trust Limited.

The project is designed to enable us to express how we care for God's World in worship and teaching; in how we look after the church and its land; in how we engage with our local community, and in the personal lifestyles of our congregation and community.

In 2021 St Michael and All Angels Church completed the unique online Eco Survey describing how we are caring for different areas of life and work. The answers we provided collected points towards an Eco Church Award; the more we were able to demonstrate that we do, the more points we got! We submitted the results of our survey, and we were awarded an Eco Church Bronze Award.

Not satisfied with a bronze award we decided in 2022 to update the answers we gave in 2021 to reflect changes we have made at the Church following Covid and completion of the restoration project. We submitted the results of our updated survey in November and have gained a Silver Award!

The PCC at St Michael and All Angels would like to encourage the Kingsland community to help us care for God's World in the following ways:

- Reducing their personal energy consumption, not difficult in today's world!

#### Ask the Question by Rick

I first met Andy in a City Infants School, when I was five! He seemed fitter and more athletic than most of us, and was good at games of all sorts at a very young age. Despite the fact that he was somewhat shorter than the average boys of his age, his energetic and confident approach to life... and his willingness to attempt any task or challenge, made him very popular. He thoroughly enjoyed playing football in the school playground or on the nearby common.

It was natural that he and I got together, as Andy lived just a few hundred yards away from me, in an adjacent street. He had to be self-sufficient from an early age as both his parents were working, and he often had to prepare his own lunchtime 'feast'...alternatively, he would come round to scrounge a 'bite to eat' at my house!

In school, he lounged at his desk – ignoring his teacher's clear instructions to 'Sit-up straight and pay attention!'

Andy continued his wayward path all through our time in the Infants School and up into the Junior School, where, far from settling down to his studies, he became even more confident and continued to do In class, he took to 'his own thing'. questioning the teacher on the very clear instruction that we were being given. More frequently, he put his hand up to say 'Why?' At first, the rest of the class thought that he was just being awkward.. or 'showing off'. Then it began to become clear to us all that the teacher's response to his questioning helped us all to understand that particular topic much better. Others tended to follow his example.

It was at this stage that my family left City life to come to the 'rural idyll' that is Kingsland! I lost touch with all my school mates.

Many years later, by chance, I found out about Andy's subsequent life. Not quite what I expected! Andy not only completed his way through Senior School... and then through University. He married, and eventually progressed to be headmaster of a prestigious grammar school! In his leisure time and retirement, he became an eminent Chess champion, respected by all!

I am proud to have known him in his formative years. It's surprising what status you can achieve by saying 'Why!'



#### **Nature Notes**

As I write these notes in Mid-December we are experiencing an unusually early start to winter ,with a fair covering of snow and plunging temperatures down to - 10 °C! Will this mark, as it did back in 1947, 1963, and again in 1982 an exceptionally long and hard winter in the UK? Time will no doubt tell!

An early casualty of the cold spell in the village was a visit to a villager's fish pond by an adventurous otter ,on its travels from the River Lugg and taking out half a dozen or so of their prize Golden Orfe fish in their garden fish pond!

Mind otters, like other mammals, will travel long distances to secure tasty morsels ,if they can find them and seem to know just where to look.

The snow of course provides for the detectives amongst us a chance to examine all the animal tracks and you can then see just how populated your garden is, with an array of rabbit, squirrel, Badger, and fox foot prints, together with all manner of birds from the odd pheasant down to our resident robins, blackbirds, & blue tits. Don't forget to fill up your bird tables with an assortment of seeds to help sustain them through the winter and at the same time give you a chance to watch their antics as they compete for what is on the table. But always protect this from another thief, the grey squirrel who is a pretty efficient burglar when it comes to it and can break into most bird feeders!

Just before the snow arrived, I noticed the snowdrops and other bulbs were just starting to push their heads up out of the ground but this cold spell may have curtailed that for now. With the turn of the year and the shortest day now behind us, hopefully spring will start to get under way and Mr Mole. who was starting to have a

go at digging up part of the lawn whilst foraging for tasty earth worms is starting to get very active!

Well where would we be in Herefordshire at this time of year, if we didn't have our lovely cider apple and other fruit orchards. The good old annual appearance, on either New Year's Eve or Twelfth Night, of the Wassailers and the Morris men, who dance around the trees, tie toast, soaked in last year's cider, to hang up in the trees, and pour some, but not all, of the cider around the tree roots. (drink the rest of it, such a shame to throw it away!) and finally fire a few shotguns off into the branches to scare off evil spirits. The objective in all seriousness is to promote a good crop next year. This past years fruit harvest, despite the drought, was, I think due to the high and late warm temperatures, of exceptional quality,

Listen out also at this time of year. You can often hear the scream of a Vixen calling to attract a male suitor as with the lengthening days they enter their breeding season. At night, working our hedgerows for its supper the dear old Barn Owl appears, providing a bright flash of white against the night, as it seeks out its prey.

On the migratory Salmon front it is not looking good news this year. Reports of salmon cutting their redds on Arrow or Lugg this time are few and far between. Why remains a mystery. They are an important barometer to climate change and an indicator of just how healthy our rivers are. Citizen scientists are busy helping the Environmental Agency by sampling our rivers and streams to test, check and report levels of Nitrate, Phosphate and other pollutants, water temperatures etc. to try and identify the causes.





#### **Hedgehog News from Pippin Cottage**

November was a difficult time for baby hedgehogs in our garden. The second week of the month we saw one out in the day light hours, so I donned my gardening gloves and carefully took it to our weighing scales. It weighed 235g, far less than the 600g plus required for hibernation, so we took it to 'Help for Hogs' in Shobdon where it was put into an incubator. A couple of days later we saw another baby, again out in the daytime, so I weighed it and again it was very underweight, so it, to, went off to Shobdon. Some nights later I was a little late putting food into the three feeding stations, and I nearly fell over another baby who had just been for a feed and was having a good drink of water. I weighed it and it was just under 600g, it looked healthy and so I put it back into the feeding station where it was safe and left it.

At the end of November, I decided that I should clean out the four hog hibernation boxes and replace the bedding material with new. I always get very nervous doing this just in-case I disturb a mother with babies or a hibernating hedgehog. In the summer Richard had made a hibernation box to put in the churchyard but when we went to take it over to the Church at the beginning of November, it was full of hay and leaves. A hedgehog had decided it was making that box its home and it had dragged hay from another of our hibernation boxes into it so now that will stay in our garden. I opened one box and there were lots of flies in it which I knew was a bad sign, as I lifted the hay, I found a dear baby hedgehog curled up with quite a few maggots on it. I asked Richard to fill a water bottle with warm water from the kettle, I put a clean towel over the water bottle, then I tucked the little hog into the fold and covered it lightly with fresh straw, Richard phoned to warn the couple at Help for Hogs of the impending

new arrival and off we went to Shobdon. Three out of four baby hedgehogs that were taken to the hedgehog sanctuary had ring worm, lung worm and another illness from drinking dirty water and they very sadly died. One is still struggling; he is eating but not gaining weight.

Next to our now five hog hibernation boxes, I always leave a pile of hay so that hedgehogs can add the finishing touches to their homes and sure enough during the first week of December, our night camera showed a juvenile hedgehog pulling hay into the tunnel and collecting leaves to make its home more comfortable. What a joy! Last night, the night camera showed the same hedgehog going into the feeding station to have some food. This is causing some concern because it is out and about in the snow and freezing temperatures, I will go out if this hedgehog does not hibernate and weigh it. I am hoping it is the one that was just under 600g and healthy but, I have a dilemma, if it is the one from the hibernation box. I don't want to scare it off, so I will seek advice on this one from Help for Hogs. What a worry these little creatures are!

We are so pleased because there is evidence that four out of five of our hibernation boxes are occupied. If you find baby hedgehogs out in the winter, please, if you can, weigh them and if they are under 600g they won't survive the winter, so get them to 'Help for Hogs' Shobdon immediately. The telephone number is: 01568 708059. It is very important to put some food and plenty of water out even in the winter just the hedgehogs case get hungry. Hedgehogs are up against so much as they struggle for survival, so please do what you can to help. Thank you.






