



#### **Nature Notes**

The very heavy rains of the past weeks, along with dark nights and cold days, have persuaded our resident Jackdaw and his Jenny Wren, somewhat belatedly, to fly south for some sunshine and warmth. They are due to return just before our spring.

The recent heavy rains here have been caused by the "La Nina" effect, thousands of miles away from the UK. La Nina is a periodic climate pattern which cools the surface of the Pacific and affects weather around the Globe.

Spring is not too far off and we have noticed that a handsome buzzard has taken up residence in a paddock behind our house. He sits on a gate post or in a tree, no doubt hoping to attract a mate. Nature can be cruel, though, as he will be tormented by jackdaws and rooks whilst in flight and on the ground, because they take unkindly to his presence. Robins are very territorial and we have one in our garden who aggressively sees off any incomers.

Catkins or lambs' tails, the male flowers of the common hedgerow tree Hazel, are appearing around the village, along with some lambs that were born just after Christmas. There are many expectant ewes in the fields and we will soon be hearing the bleating of the young lambs and mothers as they call to each other.

Bulbs are shooting up and snowdrops and hellebores are flowering. Like it or not the lawn mowing season is fast approaching and we will soon hear the chorus of Flymos and Briggs and Strattons. We could even see one of the endangered species of Suffolk Swifts or Suffolk Colts.

I will be back again in a month's time. Best wishes.



#### **Parish Council Matters**

Information on Kingsland Parish Council can be found at: <u>kingsland-pc.gov.uk</u>. The full minutes of parish council meetings are published on this website. What follows represents highlights of the most recent meeting(s) and should not be considered as an official record. The official record is the agreed minutes of the parish council.

#### **Parish Traffic Management Plan**

The parish council approached West Mercia Police's Road Safety team last autumn and subsequently held an on-site meeting on North Road with their traffic management advisor. Before this, West Mercia Police attended the annual parish meeting in May 2022 and took away a request to carry out speed enforcement in the parish, including North Road, and speeding has been communicated previously to the safer neighbourhood team, West Mercia Police as the top community priority. The outcome of the autumn meeting was for the road safety team to assess the speeding issue on North Road by taking accurate readings, and this was done in early December 2022.

The traffic management advisor has told the parish council that the data shows the speeds taken meet the criteria for enforcement (the average speed for 85 percent of vehicles was measured at 37mph). The traffic management advisor is to discuss next steps with the road safety team and will advise the parish council on what will happen next. At the time of writing, the parish council is waiting on the outcome of an internal site meeting held by the road safety team on 12 January 2023.

At the parish council meeting held on 11 January 2023, the speed data provided by the road safety team was reviewed by councillors. It was decided to ask a working group to help develop a long-term traffic plan for the parish, and to invite members of the public to participate in the working group, similar to participation by local people in the neighbourhood development plan.

The traffic plan, once completed, should be used by Herefordshire Council and West Mercia Police, in consultation with the parish council, to help inform highway improvements, including those using s106 developer contributions. For example, there is an outstanding developer contribution funded project requested by the parish council, and due for delivery by Herefordshire Council, the highway authority, for flashing lights and a 20mph zone by the school.

Another project funded by the parish council is to have a pair of village gates and new road markings to the south of Kingsland where the new 40mph zone meets the 30mph zone. There will be a new beige road surface by the village gates as well. This highway improvement project is expected to be constructed by Balfour Beatty soon (weather permitting).

#### Could this be you?

Here's an interesting fact: If a car hits a pedestrian at 27MPH then the impact is equivalent to a fall from the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of a building (7.3metres).

The result isn't pretty (I've seen it) and is frequently terminal.

Here's the death rate for different impact speeds:

Impact Speed MPH	Death rate
20-30	2.5 to 20%
30-40	20 to 90%
40-50	90 to 100%
50-60	100%
60-70	100%

What is the point of these depressing figures?

Here's the result of one week's monitoring (commencing 30<sup>th</sup> November 2022) by West Mercia Police on all vehicle speeds on North Road, a 30 MPH zone, undertaken following a request by the Parish Council:

Recorded speed MPH	Number of vehicles
20-30	2718
30-40	3359
40-50	543
50-60	48
60-70	7

It's depressing, and clearly we have a dangerous problem with a substantial number of less capable drivers who travel through our village. On any given day, there are 85 vehicles travelling at a speed which, if they collide with a walker, child or cyclist will almost certainly kill them.

Seven an hour, during daylight.

The Parish Council have determined to tackle the issue and produce a traffic management plan to keep our community safe. This needs to progress at pace.

They also need our support and guidance, so please will you find time to come to the next parish council meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> February (7.30 pm start) at the Coronation hall?

We cannot afford to ignore this issue any longer.

#### **Hedgehog News**

Not much news so far this month but there is some activity. 'Little One' as I call him, is still coming out of his hibernation box for food, he isn't eating much because he is quite sleepy, I expect, but he is still eating and growing, which is good. I have also had to put fresh hay in the container outside his box because he is still making his home cosy. The same applies to another box which is in the compost area.

I thought because there isn't much activity, I would share some moments with you from 2021/22. We had taken about four baby hedgehogs to the Shobdon hedgehog sanctuary because they were born too late in the year; three of them survived so gradually they came back to us. One male and two females.

One I remember very well, we called him 'Bully Boy' because being a male he was always picking a fight with other hogs in our garden. He lived in one of our boxes for quite a long time and then when he moved on, he came back to our garden nearly every night for a year. There was another hedgehog, which was not returned to us, but just appeared, and we named him 'One Eye' because as his name suggests, he only had one eye! I became so protective of him and worried about him, but he gave as good as he got from 'Bully Boy'. I was very sad when he finally disappeared from our garden.

It was so amusing watching them when they met up in the feeding stations, there was usually a tussle and then one would curl up and wait for its turn, or quickly disappear. One night there was a hog waiting to go into feed, when suddenly like a bolt of lightning, the hedgehog that had been eating, came charging down the tunnel and bowled the waiting hedgehog over, there was a fight and off he went. This sort of behavior only usually happens in the spring, in autumn they are a little more tolerant of each other.

Richard and I were sitting in the garden late one evening in the summer of 2021, when we heard hedgehog grunts and there was a male walking round and round a tiny female, we thought we would sit and watch as it could be interesting! After about fortyfive minutes, by which time it was becoming a little tiresome, the noise made by this male was so loud that another male appeared, the female ran off and so did the two males and we were left thinking what a disappointment that was!! That year we had about eight different hedgehogs visiting our garden, all of them with different markings and we gave each one a name.

To finish for this month, I often think as I walk round the garden, especially when it is wet and windy, or I am extremely tired after a long day of gardening, why did I start this, every day removing dirty newspaper from the feeding stations and replacing with clean (hedgehogs are very messy in their feeding stations), then putting fresh food out, washing the eleven water bowls, garden scattered around the replenishing with fresh water, but then, when I see these little creatures, I know why! Don't forget to keep putting food out and CLEAN water.
