Dear Readers,

Whilst Julie is enjoying a well-earned Australian summer holiday, and until her leave is over, I have agreed to write the front-page article as I did during an earlier inter-regnum.

This year the whole of March lies in Lent which began on February 22nd. The World Day of Prayer will be celebrated at Kingsland Methodist Church on Friday 3rd March beginning at 2.00 pm, and Messy Church at Kingsland on Sunday 5th at 9.30 am will be another opportunity for those taking part to think about prayer. You and your children are warmly invited.

'Mothering Sunday' is traditionally the 4th Sunday in Lent so this year the Mothering Sunday service will be at 11.00 am on Sunday 19th. This would be an excellent chance for whole families to come to church to make sure that Mum knows she is appreciated.

There is to be a book-launch in Kingsland Church on April 14th. The book contains detailed information about the Battle of Mortimer's Cross, is entitled 'Mortimer Landscape of North Herefordshire' and has been written by Bill Jackson. Full details will be in April edition of the Kingsland News, but save the date if you would like to attend.

Another future event for which the date should be noted is a major art and sculpture exhibition to be held in our Parish Church. Taking place from the 26th May through to the 11th June, the theme of the exhibition will be 'Fire'. As this is the time of Pentecost in the Church calendar, this is an appropriate topic for the many local and national artists who have agreed to submit work for display and for sale. Many of you may remember the remarkable exhibition held some years ago when the theme was 'Angels', and we fully expect this to surpass even that successful event, given the number and enthusiasm of potential exhibitors. The exhibition will be curated by local residents Charles McCarthy and Ruth Cameron-Swann.

Helen Webb writes "A celebration in flowers is planned from Friday 7th to Sunday 9th July in Kingsland Church. There will be displays reflecting all areas of birthdays celebration from anniversaries, festivals, nature, music and more. It would be lovely for the whole village to be involved. There will also be a plant stall, activities for children, tea and cakes, and a concert on Saturday 8th July." In connection with the plant stall, Carina Cooper and Linda Pettit, who will be responsible for it, are asking for you to grow plants to be sold on the stall. It will be open from 10.00 am to 4 pm on the three days of the event. Plants will be needed from July 6^{th} , and should be labelled to make identification easier.

Lighter mornings and evenings in March will encourage thoughts of Spring as will the profusion of early flowers. Passiontide begins at the end of the month, and on Sunday, March 26th Kingsland Church Choir and Friends will be singing 'Olivet to Calvary' by J.H.Maunder. This makes a splendid beginning to the season and I hope you will be able to attend,

Dog owners have a <u>legal duty</u> both to keep their dogs under control and to clean up their dog's poo! Thank you for your cooperation,



Hedgehog News from Pippin Cottage.

Not much news this month I'm afraid. 'Little one' has got so fat that he is having great difficulty scratching himself and the problem with hedgehogs getting too fat is, they are unable to curl up to protect themselves, but as much as I love him, I'm afraid I am not sitting up all night to stop him eating!! This is the only hedgehog we have seen on our camera recently but looking at the hog houses, there are more hibernating.

A cat was getting into one of the hedgehogs' feeding stations, so we have had to make the entrance hole smaller to deter it. Hedgehogs will get into smaller holes if they want to.

Hedgehog Facts:

The name hedgehog is derived from the word hedge – where they build their nests (along with bushes and shrubs) and hog from the snorting/grunting noise they make, which is like a pig/warthog. They are a distant relative of the shrew.

There are 17 species of hedgehog in the world, they are similar but with small differences. The UK has the European hedgehog. Hedgehog numbers in the UK are much smaller than in the 1950's. They are now in the vulnerable to extinction category.

Elastic bands can seriously injure hedgehogs so please pick them up if you see them on the ground.

A hedgehog highway is a series of holes in hedges and walls, allowing hedgehogs free access to travel through our gardens. PLEASE facilitate this if you can.

Hopefully I will have more news for you all next month. Keep putting the food and water out. Thank you.

'WAR'.....by Rick

The war in Ukraine has brought back vivid memories to the few of us who can remember the war of 1939-45 in which Adolf Hitler and the Nazi Party in Germany set out to take over the surrounding countries - and to destroy all opposition.

As a young boy living in Coventry, with its many factories, workshops and position in the heart of the Midlands, I remember all too well the period from 1940 to 1942 during which, like many other industrial cities, it was subjected to intense and frequent bombing raids, in an attempt to stop the manufacture of arms, tanks, aircraft etc. which were being built there. The Germans announced this as the 'Blitzkrieg' which would devastate all our major industrial cities... so that eventually they could invade Britain.

The effects of the war on a schoolboy were many. Food rationing changed our diets. Young teachers at school disappeared, as conscription they meant that immediately enrolled into the armed services, housewives put on overalls and headscarves to work in the factories. My father (ex-Navy in the first world war) became an air-raid warden - we didn't see much of him as he was out most nights as soon as the siren went (as well as doing his normal day-time job as a baker and confectioner). At night-time the Black-out was complete, so that the German bombers couldn't see where their targets were.... but many of the older generation suffered falls and trips in the inky blackness of the night! Most of us had an 'Anderson' air-raid shelter' in our back-garden.. a cold damp structure of steel sheets, sunk into the ground – and then covered in soil. It gave a good protection but was a dis-spiriting place to spend the night.

Our local common, some half a mile away, was once a place of freedom, where we youngsters could go and play football or whatever took our fancy. Now it was a war zone, being used by the army for their anti-aircraft guns and barrage balloons, all designed to keep the German bomber-planes away.

Part of it was taken for a deep and spacious underground shelter! We still went up to the common on a Saturday to see what was new!

It was in November 1940 that the sirens went one evening and we prepared for another air-raid. but this one was different, there were waves of bombers coming over Coventry and dropping their bombs - mostly on the city centre and surroundings. It went on for hours and there was a red glow in the sky when the 'all-clear ' siren sounded in the early The anti-aircraft guns and the morning, barrage balloons had not deterred the enemy planes. The first wave had dropped lots of incendiary bombs on the centre of the city and the following squadrons mostly dropped their high explosives into that burning area...but there were a few 'strays'...bombs that dropped into the suburbs.

Around 6am Dad came home looking drawn and tired after a long spell of duty. After a drink and a snack, he recovered somewhat and said, 'It's no good! I must go into the City and find out what has happened! Who's coming with me?' My mother having backed out, quite rightly saying that it wasn't safe, I alone went with him.

Dawn was just breaking as we walked the mile or so into the town centre. Dad still had his wardens gear on - I was in a my school clothes and cap - with a heavy

warm scarf. There was a smoky smell in the air, there were occasional buildings on fire, there were cars and ambulances rushing about and in one street there was a lorry which had pitched down into a bomb crater. We pressed on until we were in Broadgate and the heart of the City. Every building seemed to be destroyed; fire hoses lay like spaghetti everywhere. There was this smell of smoke and burning. turned right up a narrow road, the Cathedral spire soared above us, but the rest of the building was smoke and flames, as were the adjacent city centre office blocks and workshops. We were both shaken and disturbed by what we had seen, and experienced. Dad found it hard to speak. 'Never forget this, will we?'

That is why, having gained experience and qualifications in Herefordshire County Architects Department, in my early 20's I applied for a job in Coventry's City Architects Department under the City Architect, Donald Gibson, who in 1951 had prepared a Development Plan for the City. As part of the dedicated team, for several years I was delighted to be involved in the reconstruction of Coventry which from then on has developed into the large and prosperous, multiracial City which is often in the news!

I am saddened by the continuing hostilities in Ukraine, and hope that the fighting and the horrors that we see, will soon end.



Nature Notes

The cold sting of winter returns on some nights but the warmer days and increasing daylight means that nature is starting to stir. At night Hedgehogs are out and about more regularly to feed, male thrushes are singing to attract mates, blue tits are searching for nest boxes, male and female blackbirds are chasing about in our garden and robins have paired up.

Whilst walking though the churchyard recently I heard the distinctive drumming of a male great spotted woodpecker that was making it known that this is his patch and he's available. He will be hoping females will start replying with their own drumming as the weather warms.

On sunny days bumblebees are being tempted out of hibernation. With the temperatures rising and the days getting

longer, large queen bees will take advantage of nectar from early flowers such as crocuses. They will also start looking for places to start a hive to raise the next generation.

When the temperature increases, even slightly, frogs can leap out of hibernation and with warmer winters caused by global warming there is a chance of frogspawn in late February/early March.

March is a good time to plant deciduous bare-root saplings, as they are still dormant. Native trees and shrubs are ideal for wildlife and can provide food, nest space and shelter for years to come.

Jackdaw will be returning to the News in a month's time.






