Preservation Centres, and prevented over 1,600 tons of produce from rotting.

So, with jam dealt with, what about Jerusalem? Sir Hubert Parry composed the for Jerusalem, choral music which accompanied the words from William Blake's poem and in 1917, Parry conducted it for the ladies of the Albert Hall choir as part of a call in favour of National Service for Women - Parry and his wife, Maud, supported the women's suffrage movement. A year later, Jerusalem was sung at a suffrage demonstration concert and it became the hymn of the Women voters. The WI adopted the song as their anthem in 1924. So, yes, Jerusalem is still popular, but we really don't sing it at our meetings (lol).

Kingsland WI has been around for over one hundred years. I'd like it to keep going and in order to do that we need new members. The mission of the WI is to provide a community where women can meet, inspire one another, pass on knowledge, skills, experiences and have a good time. Importantly, we want to stay up to date and be relevant to the women in our community.

April and May are no different, with more family activities, more information sessions and talks, more digging about in Kingland's history and even an art exhibition planned.

The Easter holidays are approaching quickly, this means we'll be returning with our brilliant Heritage Heroes workshops at the beginning of the month, this time led by woodworker Andrew Pearson (who you may remember from our January crafting event). The Familiar Treasures Project will be launching a new heritage skills programme, in the form of 5 Saturday workshops here in Kingsland. Details aren't quite finalised yet, as we need to be sure there's enough interest from people!

Workshops will take place from 10am – 3pm and will include a short talk with slides, followed by hands on training in a range of activities such as:

- Wattle and daub

- Plastering

Nature Notes

Jackdaw and Jenny Wren have yet to fly north from warmer climes so here I am again.

You may recall I said last month that "The cold sting of winter returns on some nights" well it certainly returned at the beginning of March, with more snow and then strong winds and rain. Apparently snow is statistically more likely to fall in March than in December. Every snow cloud has a silver lining and the additional bird food we put out attracted a small murmuration of starlings and a large flock of chaffinches. S tarlings are rarely seen in our garden and chaffinches seldom arrive in such large numbers.

Sparrows are nesting in 2 boxes in our garden. The box on the garage was intended to house Blue Tits but somehow Mr and Mrs Sparrow, pair No 1, are managing to squeeze through a 28mm diameter hole. The box in the hedge at the bottom of the garden was intended for Robins but as they did not seem interested in the last 2 years I adapted it for Great Tits. Mr and Mrs Sparrow, pair No 2, have decided to take up residence in it this year!

Our log store has diminished in size over the winter months as expected, but the mouse nest I exposed recently was not expected. It does seem to be uninhabited and there are no signs of fresh droppings in the logs.

If you ever walk through St Michael and All Angels Churchyard you may have noticed that there are 5 or 6 grey squirrels racing up and down the yew tree by the north door and the remains of Christmas lights hanging down from on high. The lights had been left in the tree after Christmas 2021 but did not work in 2022 when they were reconnected. It would seem



The latest from Mortimer Medical Practice Patients' Participation Group

As we enter Spring and hopefully the weather improves the Practice would like to thank everyone for their courtesy and tolerance in the challenging time the Practice faced during the Winter Pressures. The Flu clinics appeared to worked well under have appointment system used, and it is intended to use it again next year with improvements on-line to facilitate bookings. Hopefully it will be possible to start the campaign earlier, subject to timely delivery of the vaccine.

The Spring Covid Booster Programme

Preliminary information has recently been announced. Booster vaccination will be available for those who are 75 years of age or over by 30 June this year and for any patient aged 5 and over who has a weakened immune system. Subject to vaccine, staff and locations being available, it is planned that Care homes will be given priority and vaccinations should start on 3 April: the rest of those in the eligible groups should follow from 17 April. Indepth details are not yet known, including how and where the vaccine will be available, but the Practice will publicise further information as soon as it becomes known.

Primary Care Network (PCN)

Herefordshire Remote Health (HRH) is a new service managed by Taurus Healthcare in an effort to make appointments more accessible to all. Through it appointments may be booked for telephone responses from a variety of clinicians, including GPs, and, working under GP supervision, Advanced Nurse Practitioners or Physician Associates.

Although these appointments may be booked through surgeries, the clinicians, who are part of a county team do not work from the Surgery but they will have access to patients' records subject to the usual security arrangements

Scrivens NHS Audiology Service; suspension of clinics

Due to circumstances beyond the Practice's control, Scrivens Audiology has suspended clinics that are normally held in Surgeries. Unfortunately, the Practice does not have access to their appointment register and so has been unable to inform customers of appointment cancellations. Regrettably no indication is known when this service will return.

Those requiring ongoing services and support are advised to ring Scrivens Patient Services on 0800 027 5102.

Since my last report our 1sts have won four out of four with two home and two away victories. We now sit 5th in the table only two points behind Hinckley. With only five games to play however the top three, Leicester Lions, Clifton and Dings Crusaders are out of reach.

We started with a 29-7 victory at home over Loughborough Students. We kept the game tight, always the best tactic if you are playing a team of Duracell Bunnies and we gradually sucked the testosterone and exuberance out of them. On the same afternoon our 2nds beat Shrewsbury 49-8 to secure the league title with a faultless record, P 19 W 19 PF 725 PA 208. In that time we have used 54 players, 33 of them try scorers and with an average age of only 23.

That day our thirds were away at Aldridge (wherever that is) and went down narrowly Their disappointment was 28 – 26. marginally increased when their trusty charabanc refused to start for the journey home. Some of them are still up there I understand having settled in and started families. It will be nice to see them when they play for Aldridge next season. It is hugely gratifying to see the close bond between our three senior teams and the movement of players between them. This season 20 players have appeared for both our 1sts and 2nds and 26 players have played 2nd and 3rd team rugby. It is unlikely that any other club can boast such versatility and depth.

Our next 1st team match was against Stourbridge the nearest thing we have to a local derby. They had only won once this season but must have raised their game for the occasion because we only managed to come away with an unconvincing 17 – 10 victory. Teams in form tend to win however

even if they play poorly. We certainly picked up the pace for our next match, at home against another bunch of hyperactive academics, Exeter University. Like Loughborough they could not match us up front and this was reflected in our 59 - 28 victory with our forwards scoring six of the nine tries most of them from close range.

For the final match of this quartet we made our first visit to Hornets, a Weston super Mare side. The weather and ground conditions prohibited any chance of champagne rugby but we did what we had to and registered a four try, bonus point 26 - 14 victory.

The rest of our sides from the Minis upwards are all having their share of successes. Our Colts beat Worcester 40 – 12 to advance to the semi finals of the North Mids Cup where our opponents will be Hereford. Now that's what I call a local derby! In the meantime our U15's are busy raising funds for their Easter Tour to Amsterdam. But don't worry Mums and Dads their time in the red light district will be strictly supervised and limited.






