

As the phones were extremely busy during the last week in September, the Practice thanks everyone for their patience as they tried to get in touch with everyone as soon as they could. They will be contacting house bound patients shortly to arrange appointments for the Practice Nurse to attend.



We had a lovely musical evening in October when Mike and Rachel Fenton played autoharp and dulcimer. They had brought along several instruments demonstrate their different sounds. Mike was first introduced to the autoharp by Johnny Cash's mother in law. It is a kind of zither developed by a German who added a felt damper to the original zither. He took this to America, the Appalachian to Mountains and to Philadelphia in the 1880s. Mike's autoharp has 37 strings and mainly plays chords. The dulcimer is also a stringed instrument shaped like an egg timer. Rachel's dulcimer had only 4 strings, though some have 5 or 6, and the dulcimer plays the melody. They played a wide range of music from the Yellow Rose of Texas to Blues tunes and had us singing along to Que Sera. Mike also demonstrated the Jews harp, a tiny contraption played by mouth.

We enjoyed a lovely evening and next month we have another musical treat on the 2nd November with Songs from the Shows by Steve Hollinghurst and would like as many people as possible to join us. There will be refreshments (mince pies, etc) at a charge of £5 a head.

Nature Notes

The late Autumnal rains arrived and, as we return hopefully to some more seasonal weather patterns, interesting to note how the countryside responded to the summer drought. A lot of trees shed leaves early and many appear to have died, particularly a lot of newly planted trees ,but when you view the apple orchards with good crops, compared to the drop in potato yields, the vast array of winter berries and oak mast appearing, prompted me to ask whether this is a mast year, where trees produce excessive seeds? This glut only occurs about once in a decade when our woodland trees of oak and ash produce bumper seed crops, coupled with the sad sight of seeing many Ash dying from Ash die back, I wonder is it natures way of trying to regenerate itself? Or is it an evolutionary survival strategy to ensure plenty of saplings, also do they do this as a defence mechanism against creatures that consume their seeds, such as Squirrels and Jays, to ensure enough is left over to grow on?.

Scientists have yet to discover why the trees do this in coordination? A mystery or something to do with the weather ?, temperature and rainfall in spring are believed to trigger a response and a cold snap in spring can also freeze the flowers of Oak and Ash, rather like it does to Blackcurrants with disastrous results to the fruit harvest.


The ultimate theory is do they communicate with each other via the fungi around their roots. This also allows them to share resources, there is a theory that the larger trees in the forest act as matriarchs and will nurture their samplings by sending food supplies to them? So there we are, food for thought, as you wrap up and take a stroll in the local woods, crunching over acorns in the whispering woods!! What was the song? Something like-Whispering grass

don't tell the trees what the trees don't need to know!

On our Rivers we hope there will now be enough water to help the Atlantic Salmon to reach their spawning grounds in the upper tributaries of the Wye and Usk, Earlier they were under great stress if they got caught in our rivers when the water temperatures became excessively high and flows low.

In our gardens its time to load up the bird tables, as their natural supplies of accessible food dwindle through the winter and well worth watching their antics to maintain winter substance. One often wonders just how sensible our migratory birds are, to zip off to warmer climes before returning in the spring.






