





Fundraising: It is with regret and trepidation that I approach this subject. We have tried hard to make our fundraising mainly for others and to run the chapel at Kingsland on Freewill offerings and lettings. However the building now needs extensive repairs if it is to continue as a place of worship and a village amenity.

When we went into the loft to get the Christmas decorations, a leak was discovered which will be temporarily repaired for the moment. We had just started getting quotes for new large windows, one of which will survive the winter only with the help of gaffer tape. Those of you who use the chapel will know that, despite the dehumidifier and some repair work in 2023, there is significant penetrating damp in one wall in particular, which may mean that the whole wall needs repointing! In order to apply for grants etc we have to show that we are 'doing our bit.'

So – there will be a monthly Coffee Morning on the second Saturday of each month for the whole year. It is proposed that each one will be slightly different so you don't get bored, but there will always be tea, coffee, cake and biscuits! (See Advert Below)



Nature Notes

After a very wet November/December, we hope after Christmas and at the turn of the year, we can look forward to some dry, bright sunny and frosty, if not snowy days as we move into the New Year, that will transform our fields and gardens into a Winter Wonderland if only briefly and provide you with an opportunity to enjoy some brisk winter walks. Don't forget to keep the winter bird food tables well topped up for our local bird population if temperatures drop off and the ground starts to freeze denying them their natural foods, (besides it always entertaining to follow their antics on and around the bird table!) If so, when out and about its interesting to try and guess some of the bird and animal footprints left in the snow.

New Year will also be marked by the Annual Wassailing events in our local villages, traditionally it was celebrated either on New Year's Day or Twelfth Night., when some but not too much of last season's cider is poured on to the roots of the cider apple trees, toast soaked in cider hung is hung in the branches of the trees and, when safe, a few rounds of shotguns fired off into the trees, to ward of all the evil spirits in the Village! The idea was to promote the new season's crop and for the villagers to have a great mid-winter outdoor celebration after Christmas, if they still have any energy left that is!

In our gardens Snowdrops, Crocus, bluebell shoots, primroses, Christmas roses and hardy winter flowers and even daffodils will start reaching for the light and will start to move, as the days slowly lengthen. Hazel catkins will start to form and just occasionally you may hear a Mistlethrush singing ,just as dusk approaches. At night, January sees the start of the breeding season for foxes and often you will hear vixens scream, a haunting sound which for

some reason or other attracts the local male suitors who may fancy their chances.

I hope this year we don't get too many visits to our garden ponds by the local otter population, coming across from the river Lugg and emptying the ponds of goldfish, as they are prone to do! In our gardens dogwoods of green and red do provide spectacular winter colour and if cut stems are placed in water, they will soon root, so you can cultivate a few more new plants.

On our farms the early new season's lambs will start arriving, so late nights in prospect for our sheep farmers and, despite the very wet autumn, we hope the winter corn crops, many of which went in late, will start to recover, manage to get established and not affect the crop yields on next season's harvest.



Kingsland's Public Rights of Way.

Having moved to Kingsland a year ago, from only 16 miles away, my wife and I were delighted with everything we found; friendly neighbours, a fantastic range of amenities and lovely surrounding countryside. There was however one thing that dampened our enjoyment of living here, it quickly became apparent that the vast majority of footpaths in the Parish were/are in a pretty sorry state.

Trying to walk them, along with our dogs, was a trial of near epic proportions needing perseverance and a degree of fitness to

make any headway at all. Paths were difficult underfoot, hedges blocked progress, stiles were broken or non-compliant and, in some cases, dangerous to climb.

Having been involved with the Parish Council where I lived previously I sought co-option and succeeded in becoming a Councillor here in Kingsland and volunteered to become your Footpaths Officer. During the summer I carried out a comprehensive survey of our PROW and gave a presentation to the PC, pointing out some of the problems and formulated a plan to make them accessible to all – from the seasoned walker to the family who would like to take the kids for a stroll.

Apart from it being impossible to achieve, I have no plans to try and bring about change overnight. I would however like to make improvements, starting early next year, on a gradual basis; after all, aptly in this case, each journey starts with the first step....

I obviously cannot do much on my own. Although I have the broad agreement and support of my fellow Councillors on the proposed next steps, (and a commitment from the PROW Officer at Herefordshire Council to support us), to make any meaningful headway requires volunteers willing to assist. This can be helping to clear routes, walking the routes to keep clear, looking for areas of improvement or even just spreading the word of what we are trying to do.

Crucial to any hope of success is the support of local landowners in, for example, reinstating PROW after planting, maintaining stiles and modernising where required, (the PC can help with this), and removing any potential barriers to walkers. I very much hope they will fully support this initiative for the benefit of all who live here.

Finally, I would just like to say that I am not a fanatical rambler, merely someone who would like to enjoy the public rights of way around our lovely village. If you would like to get involved, at any level, or just offer support and words of encouragement, please contact me on



Hedgehog News

I miss seeing lots of hedgehogs on our camera. We appear to only have a small one popping into the feeder now and again. He looks healthy enough and is only out at night, so I am not worried. No poorly hedgehogs have been brought to us either, which is good news.

As I have little to report, you might find the following interesting.

- In Medieval times people thought that hedgehogs carried fruit on their backs, supposedly to do with table decoration, hence pineapple, cocktail sticks with sausages and pineapple.
- It was believed that hedgehogs stole milk from cows' udders so, in 1566 Elizabethan Parliament, without real evidence, put a bounty on their heads and thousands died.
- If a hedgehog went into a house, it was considered bad luck.

Please continue to put out food and water for hedgehogs. Even when the weather gets very cold, they may still want to munch on a few biscuits. You may save a hedgehog's life if they know where to find food and are desperate. If the biscuits aren't being eaten, then replace them every few days. Stale biscuits are not good for hedgehogs. Water is essential. Our little hedgehog is drinking a lot.

Sorry I don't have any hedgehog news, but perhaps no news is good news!! Let us hope that the weather in 2024 will be kinder to our little prickly friends. They have had an awful time this year and so many babies have died. Keep up the good work.



If I had been told on September 1st that at the half way point in the season our 1sts would be top of National 2 West and our 2nds top of Counties 1 Midlands West (South) with the following records.

1sts P 14 W 11 L3 PF 465 PA 257 **2nds** P 12 W 12 L 0 PF 523 PA 126

I would have been delighted.

The 1sts have played five matches since my last report with three wins and two losses. We started with a trip to Clifton and a bonus point victory. Clifton fielded a young side who gave us a sterner test than last season but we opened with an early try from Charlie Grimes followed by another from Ben Link before Clifton hit back with a try of their own and we turned around at the break with a 12 - 5 advantage. second half try from Giles Morrell and a Louis Silver penalty saw us stretch away but Clifton scored two converted tries and it took a final Rob Aikman try and conversion to secure us a 27 - 22 victory. Clifton did have some measure of success however when a late penalty secured them a losing bonus point.

Our next game was at home against Chester which we won 42 - 19. This included another bonus point and a hat trick of tries for hooker Ben Link. A third victory followed when we travelled to Weston Super Mare to face Hornets and won 30 - 17. Hornets had been averaging over 40 points a game at home this season so

restricting them to 17 was an achievement. Again Rob Aikman got us the bonus point with a try in the last minute, at some cost however. The cover defense smothered him as he crossed and when he got up the tip of his nose was pointing at his left ear, no suggestion of foul play, just the sort of accident that can happen in a contact sport. A visit to the local hospital restored his film star looks but he will be missing for a couple of matches.

When you are top of the pile you become a target for all the teams below you and this was the case when Hinckley rode into town, a team lying 5th in the league and showing a run of form. With a wet pitch and a wind that reached gale force in bursts we were beaten at home for the first time since our loss to Redruth in October 2022. It was a converted try each at the break but we failed to crack the best defense we have met this season in the second half and they snatched a second try for a 12 - 7 win. In truth Hinckley were marginally the better They scarcely missed a tackle, side. adapted to the conditions slightly better and stole a couple of key line outs as we pressed on their line.

Our final match before Christmas was an away trip to Old Redcliffians, a team we had beaten comfortably at home in September. It was a repeat of last season when we had also won comfortably at home but had lost the return fixture. It happened again. We played down a very considerable slope in the first half and were leading 17 - 3 at the break but Old Reds

raised their game in the second half and a converted try in injury time saw them pinch it by 18 points to 17. We are still top of the league by 5 points however as our closest rivals Dings and Camborne could only draw their matches that day.

In other news, in November we hosted a complimentary breakfast for farmers, landowners and other people who make their living from the land to bring them up to date with current legislature, policies and practices. The lead speaker was John Amos, Head of Rural for Bruton Knowles and there were 45 attendees. Also in November our Vixens did a sponsored bike ride and raised £924 for "Services for Independent Living" an organization that provides the care and support that enables

old and disabled people to remain living in their own homes.

To finish, I have some exciting news. My modesty was going to prevent me telling you but my wife insisted you would want to know. I have been nominated by The Aimstree Chronicle for their prestigious "Sports Reporter of the Year" award. The presentation will take place at The Temperance Hall in Aberystwyth with a black tie and wellingtons dinner on Christmas Eve. I will let you know how I get on.

In the meantime, I hope 2024 is kind to you and may the world become a better place.

Historical Jottings

Alphonse Bertillon was a worry for his well-respected Parisian father, a government statistician. He had been expelled from the prestigious Imperial Lycée of Versailles, failed to hold a job down in France, and had the same experience during his travels in England. In 1875, at the age of 22, young Alphonse joined the French army, but did not distinguish himself and left after a few years without furthering his education or making himself more employable. Calling in personal favours, his father arranged for him to join the Paris police as a clerk.

Perhaps sparking some dormant personality trait, the work of filing and indexing appealed to Alphonse. He became frustrated with the system used for identifying criminals and the impossibility of matching them to crimes for which they had previously been convicted. In his spare time, using inmates at the La Santé Prison, Bertillon developed a system anthropomorphic measurements of body size and shape, going on to introduce mugshots of arrested persons to identify recidivists. Alphonse also developed the of ballistics. science invented dynamometer to measure the force used in breaking and entering, and started the use of compounds to preserve shoeprints at crime scenes.

By 1894, Alphonse Bertillon was one of the foremost experts in forensics. He gave evidence for the prosecution at the Dreyfus trial, claiming that one of the letters had been written by Dreyfus in a disguised hand. This was one area in which Bertillon was not an expert, however, but his

"moonstruck eyes, his sepulchral voice, the saturnine magnetism" and "presence of a necromancer" caused the jury to accept Bertillon's flawed evidence, leading to a terrible miscarriage of justice. The innocent Dreyfus was convicted of spying and sent to Devil's Island. He was finally cleared in 1906.

Two years later, in June 1896, a large number of bodies began to be washed up on the shore of Ushant, an island off the coast of Brittany. The local fishermen were recovering new bodies daily, and police were unable to make identifications. The steam packet Drummond Castle, *en route* from Cape Town to London, had run aground on rocks late at night, as its passengers were below decks getting ready for bed or sleeping. In all fifty-three bodies of men, women and children, many naked or in night clothes were washed ashore. There were only three survivors.

The local police sent for Bertillon who, using personal information from families and marks on the bodies, was able to make a positive identification of all but two.

On board the ship was the Gethin family. John Gethin was born at Brick House, Kingsland in 1866 and schooled at St Peter's in Hereford. He trained as an architect and set up practice in Cardiff, where he met Emily Thompson, the daughter of a director of the Barry Railway The couple were married in Company. 1890. After the arrival of Lorna, in 1892, and John, in 1894, Mrs Gethin was in fragile health and the family took an extended break in South Africa for the With them went their friend. climate. Jemima Peace, and the children's nurse,

Eliza Preston. All travelled as first class passengers.

Sadly, the Gethins and their companions were not among the bodies washed ashore. They are commemorated in a brass plaque on the chancel wall to the left of the altar in Kingsland Church. They are also commemorated on the grave stone of Emily's father, Thomas Roe Thompson, which is near the gate into the churchyard of St Dochdwy's church, Llandough near Penarth. On the orders of Queen Victoria, a medal was struck for those involved in the rescue efforts.

Before his death in 1914, Bertillon wrote a paper on the use of 16 characteristics of fingerprints that he thought were unique to each individual. This was used to develop the system of fingerprinting still in use today.
